

Wide open Calico Bass, small barracuda and mostly small white Seabass for 4 hours straight nonstop.


Great live sardines.

BIG BAIT, BIG FISH?

Valid. But outside of tuna, locally, it has rarely panned out for me. Occasionally, I'll spot a mackerel in the tank, to which I've been told my whole fishing life that whatever bites it will be a good one. No doubt! Problem is, I can't remember ever getting a bite on one!

To make matters worse, while I'm soaking this mackerel, anglers around me are getting bit using anchovies or sardines! To reiterate, I'm not doubting the concept. Rather, maybe the concept needs to be expanded upon when it comes to fishing our local 1/2, 3/4, and even overnight waters.

"In my opinion, the successful deployment of "big bait, big fish" means understanding the data Mother Nature provides. There's a time and place for it as one size doesn't fit all. First, I like to see what the current is doing. With low or no current, I find there isn't enough activity to keep fish as interested. If water temps drop suddenly and dramatically, it could slow their metabolism. And I like to know what they've been feeding on to help plan my approach hard and fast, or slow and easy.

Downsizing your tackle and downgrading your presentation doesn't mean you won't catch bigger fish. It's simply adjusting to conditions to increase your odds of success. Big bait, big fish...totally agree. But if you're not getting bit, you're not getting bit. Time to DO WORK!

I've caught more 5-7lbs calico bass on the small grub in general then I have with the 6.5" swimbait. The 6.5" swimbait, however, is one of my go-to's casting it far towards boiler rocks into the turbulence...bigger profile for them to see and even feel.



How to Make Tuna Poke Bowls

This is just the overview so you can see what you're actually getting into here. When you are cooking, you'll want to use the full recipe at the bottom of the page.


- 1. Mix Rice Take your cooked rice and mix in half of the seasoning packet.
- 2. Assemble Split the poke bowl toppings between the two bowls evenly.
- 3. Prep Fish Slice your fish into cubes.

 Sprinkle some of your shoyu over the fish and gently toss to evenly coat. Split the fish between the two bowls.
- 4. Garnish Drizzle your sriracha and wasabi mayo over the poke bowls. Sprinkle with furikake.
- 5. Enjoy Whip out the chopsticks and get busy enjoying this delicious poke bowl you made at home!


