If you want to lock in a spot on one of our 2026 boats, be sure to attend that meeting—otherwise, you may end up on the waiting list







### TARIFFS ON FISHING GEAR WHEN TRAVELING TO MEXICO

Report submitted by VCSC leader, Norm Rodewald on 11/8/25 > READ ONLINE

We need to tell members that are planning to go fishing in Mexico (Cedros Island or Cabo for instance) that there are new tariff regulations.

A tourist is allowed to bring in four fishing sets (rod and reel) tax free. All rods and reels over the four-set limit are subject to a 19% tariff.

So, a \$1000 Accurate ATD will result in a \$190.00 tax. Fishermen arriving at Cabo to go big game fishing have been hit with bills over \$500.

\*\* Doing more research with "Ai" more information has been gathered. Read on ...

Yes, in addition to the VCSC report, recent updates confirm that Mexico enforces a 19% import tariff on fishing gear exceeding four rod-and-reel sets per tourist. This policy is part of broader tariff reforms affecting recreational equipment and sportfishing gear.

#### Mexico's Fishing Gear Tariff Policy (2025)

- Tax-Free Allowance: Tourists may bring up to four fishing sets (rod and reel) into Mexico without paying tariffs.
- Tariff Rate: Any additional rods or reels beyond the four-set limit are subject to a 19% import tax.
- Example: A \$1,000 reel like the Accurate ATD would incur a \$190 tariff. Anglers traveling to Cabo or Cedros Island have reported tariff bills exceeding \$500 for high-end gear.

#### **Property** Broader Tariff Context

- Aluminum Tariffs: Mexico has implemented 10-25% tariffs on aluminum imports, which may affect fishing reels and accessories made from aluminum.
- De Minimis Entry Rules: While products under \$800 in value may qualify for tax exemption under de minimis rules, enforcement varies and may not apply to sportfishing gear.
- Sportfishing Industry Impact: The American Sportfishing Association (ASA) has flagged these tariffs as disruptive, especially for anglers traveling with specialized equipment.

#### **S** Travel Tips for Anglers

- Pack Smart: Limit your gear to four rod-and-reel sets to avoid extra fees.
- Declare Honestly: Mexican customs officials are actively enforcing these rules, especially at popular sportfishing destinations like Cabo San Lucas.
- Consider Shared Gear: If traveling with a group, coordinate gear to stay within limits.
- Stay Updated: Tariff enforcement and exemptions may shift, so check with your charter operator or local consulate before traveling.

The fundraising portion of the event was a success.


- Net proceeds from the dinner: \$3,824.00

# Westlake great-grandmother reels in trophy fish off Canada coast

89-year-old resident snags jumbo 4-foot halibut in B.C.

It sounds like a proverbial fish story, but it's true; an 89-year-old woman from Westlake Village caught a more than 62-pound halibut—just shy of the size limit for keeping—off the northern Pacific coast of Canada this summer.

Molly Zimmermann reeled in and boated the jumbo catch with the help of her husband Brian, 88. The couple, coming up on 61 years of marriage, were at the start of their 37th fishing trip to British Columbia's Queen Charlotte Islands when Molly felt her line stuck on something that would take almost an hour to haul in.

"It can be very rough, and I get seasick sometimes," Molly said. But this particular first day, July 26, was "calm and beautiful," she recalled, "so we said, 'yes, we'll go out to the lighthouse."

Originally from England, the Zimmermanns have lived in the Westlake Trails neighborhood since 1974. On their annual trips to the fishing lodge on Langara Island, they still ply the waters in their 19-footer.

"They keep saying that we're too old to go out alone in a boat, but we know what we're doing," said Brian. As a new arrival in America in the 1960s, he got a job as a Fuller Brush salesman before working his way up, eventually becoming a cosmetics executive. Molly worked as a secretary at an insurance investigator's office.

Having set out late in the morning, the Zimmermanns were a long way from the lodge when Molly hooked into what they first believed to be a piece of seabed debris. "It was pretty deep there, probably 200-feet deep at least," she said.

Brian moved the boat this way and that, trying to release the line.

"He said, 'Oh, we were probably stuck on a rock or seaweed, and that's what you're pulling up because it's heavy," Molly said. "So I wound and wound and wound, and then I got tired, and I said, 'You've got to wind some.' So he wound and wound and wound, and we just thought we had pulled up a lump of coral."

Molly pulled on the rod with its unknown weight when Brian told her to slow down. "He said, 'Oh, yes, you've got a little fish, it must have hooked into a rock as well, being so difficult to



## THE PERCEPTION OF THE 100-YARD CAST




### Brian Nguyen "the\_cigar\_afishinado"

Depending on how you look it, it's either a lofty goal or easily achieved: 300 Feet = 100 Yards or . . . 100 Yards = 300 Feet

If your cast clears your 100-yard topshot, then for all intents and purposes, it should be a hundred yard cast. However, the only way this goes unchallenged is if you made your cast without altitude, and without arc... without a bow (slack) generated mid-air.

The amount of line out from the arc (altitude) of your cast impacts your overall distance. But bullet passes aren't conducive to distance in football, and bullet casts aren't conducive to distance in sportfishing. Taking body mechanics out of the equation, casting is about trajectory the combination forward of momentum and arc.

Using a laser range finder at my Surface Iron Casting Dynamics class, the average casting distance of eight students with a three ounce lure was 40.25 yards (120ft and 9in). Done with efficient body mechanics, delivered accurately to where the fish are, and without backlash; in practice on land or on the water, this a good cast. Is there room for improvement? Certainly. Do you want to improve? If so, are you willing to put in the practice time needed to improve? Million dollar questions.

"To each there comes during their trip a special moment when they are figuratively tapped on the shoulder and offered the chance to do a very special thing, unique to them and fitted to their talents. What a tragedy if at the sight of terns diving and fish boiling, this opportunity finds them missing their target or picking out a backlash for that which could have been their finest hour."
